memory stick - nothing more! Output by e-mail is also possible up to a certain file size.

1 Formats?

The output formats are PDF as well as other formats (e.g. JPG). If required, later printing is possible (replaces copying).

OCR ("optical character recognition") is possible - the file becomes searchable, text recognition or optical character recognition are possible. Attention when saving: very large files, can take a very long time and take up memory space.

2 Scanning instead of copying - why?

Scanning is...

... more gentle on books > light, heat damages books, spines can break through the flap of the copier.

no superfluous pages.

In addition to the materials to be scanned, at best just a USB

... faster and more convenient (with some practice and

knowledge), no black margins, automatic "finger" removal,

... more environmentally friendly - paperless policy and thus

the sustainable idea of our university is supported.

4 Copyright?

At the beginning of the scan, you must confirm a disclaimer. This disclaimer states that you are not scanning a whole book/work and thus violating copyright.

No complete uploads of whole books are allowed on Blackboard!

5 Where to find?

The book scanner is located at the back of the library's reading room and can be used during the opening hours of the Open Library.
